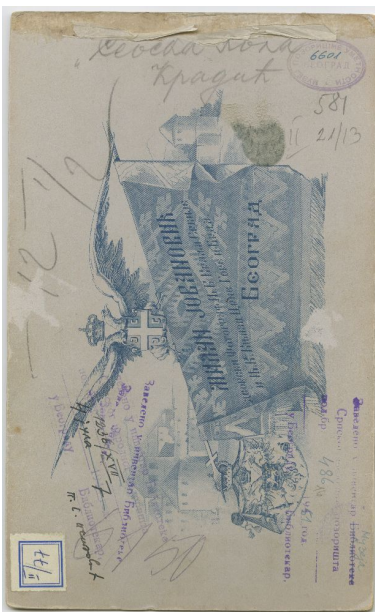

Description:	Full-length shot of a man in the stage costume of a drunkard. He is holding a stick in his right hand and has a pipe in his mouth. Artificial rocks on the floor and a painted canvas backdrop depicting the sea are creating the impression of the scene being set outdoors.
Comment:	Mita Kradić' is the central character in the theater play 'Seoska Lola' (A Village Carouser) by Ede Tóth and Deskašev. Petar "Pera" Dobrinović (Belgrade, 1853 – Novi Sad, 1923) was an actor and director at the Serbian National Theatre in Novi Sad and at the Royal Serbian National Theatre in Belgrade. Before becoming one of the greatest actors on the Serbian stage, he worked as a journeyman in his father's barbershop in the centre of Belgrade.
